Warranty

Two full years limited warranty on all parts and workmanship. Provided the Clubrunner Caddy is used and maintained only as recommended and is not subject to commercial use, misuse, negligence or wilful damage and no unauthorized service or modifications are made to it, the manufacturer warrants to the original purchaser, that the product is free from defects in the material and workmanship for a period of two full years from the date of purchase.

The Battery charger is warranted by the original equipment manufacturer. Batteries supplied with the Clubrunner Caddy are warranted against defects by the original equipment manufacturer. (See separate warranty declaration supplied with the battery).

The manufacturer will, at its option, either repair or replace any defective parts, free of charge to the purchaser. Freight charges involved in returning goods for repair will be the responsibility of the purchaser.

This warranty does not cover accidental damage and specifically excludes claims for indirect, incidental or consequential damages.



ASSEMBLY

Battery Assembly

Assemble the Leadwire - Battery to the battery teminals using the nuts and bolts provided. (see figure).

Position the red terminal cover over the positive terminal post as shown.




Bag Rest Assembly


Remove screw, nut and two metal grommets from the owner's manual packet.

Chose either the upper mounting location holes or the lower position, based on your preference and / or the height of your golf bag. Place the metal grommets in the tube depressions on each side of the handle.

Position the bag rest over the holes and grommets, align the holes and assemble the bolt and nut as shown.


Click the bag rest onto the tube and check for suitable position. Secure nut and bolt.





Tension Knob Assembly

Thread the tension knob into the chassis and nut as shown.



OPERATION

Connect the retractable front wheel to the chassis by lifting up on the release knob, engaging the tube in the chassis, release the release knob and slide the tube into the chassis until it latches securely.

Note:-

For storage, the front wheel assembly can be removed completely, or simply slid in toward the chassis.

Slide the handle tube into the chassis mounting hole and secure by tightening the tension knob.

Note:-

To remove the handle after use, simply loosen the tension knob, lift out the handle and fold the upper bag rest


Place the battery assembly into the battery compartment and connect the battery connector to the chassis connector matching the colours red to red, black to black.


After use, disconnect the battery, remove from the caddy and connect to the battery charger.


Replace the battery cover.

Ensure the power switch on the handle is in the off position, then plug in the control cable jack as shown in picture #2.

Place your golf bag on the bag rest brackets. Secure by fitting the long velcro strap through the "D" ring, pull snugly and flatten velcro into place.









OPERATION (CONTINUED)

Rotate the speed control knob fully counter clockwise. Switch the power switch to "On". Rotate the speed control knob clockwise until the desired walking speed is attained.. The power switch can now be used for on/off control.


A "soft-start" feature is built in to provide smooth acceleration when switching to the "on" position.

Speed control changes can be made while moving to obtain your optimum walking speed.

Note:-

If the caddy is stationary, switch the power switch "off".

Never leave the unit switched on and the speed control knob turned down to zero. As well as draining power, this could cause overheating of circuitry.



BATTERY MAINTENANCE AND CHARGING

The battery supplied with your Clubrunner product should be charged immediately after every round of golf.


Do not use any other type of charger to charge the battery. Serious damage or personal injury could result.


Prior to using, read carefully the additional instructions supplied with the battery charger.

Battery Handling Precautions

- Never place the battery near fire.
- Never short the terminals.
- If battery cracks due to mishandling and dilute sulfuric acid contacts the skin, wash it off immediately with water. If sulfuric acid contacts the eyes, wash them with lots of water and see a doctor.
- Recharge the battery as soon as possible after use.
- When battery is not to be used for a long period, store in a cool place, preferably below 20 deg. C.
 We advise that the battery remain on the charger connected to the AC.
- Dropping or otherwise mishandling the battery may result in irreversible damage to the battery which would result in having to replace the battery.

WARNING: Leaving a battery in a discharged or semi-discharged state is the leading cause of premature battery failure.





WARNING: Battery posts, terminals and related accessories contain lead and lead compounds, chemicals known to the state of California to cause cancer and birth defects or other reproductive harm. Wash hands after handling.

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

This device is not a toy. Care should be taken at all times as there are high torque drives in operation.

All batteries are live power sources which typically contain caustic materials. Serious injury or fire may result if the battery is not handled properly. If a metal object (such as the metal shaft on a golf club) contacts both battery terminals, the battery may short out, possibly starting a fire in your vehicle.

The preferred transportation method is to place the chassis of the electric golf caddy in the trunk of your car, securing it from excessive movement. Place the battery in the battery compartment of the chassis and replace the battery cover over the battery. If this is not possible, then please be sure to follow the four steps below:-

- 1. Install the red terminal cover. (see Battery Assembly section of this manual)
- 2. Cover the battery terminals and wires to prevent shorting or arcing across the terminals. The battery cover is an appropriate choice as a terminal and wire cover. It is further recommended that the cover be secured by a strap or bungee during transportation.
- 3. The battery must be secured in place (in trunk or rear seat floor) to prevent shifting or tipping.
- 4. Make certain that golf bag and golf club shafts are secure and will in no way contact the battery terminals.

The Clubrunner golf caddy "free wheels" in a forward direction. This allows you to push the cart without motor assist. The feature also allows conserving power going downhill when the power switch can be turned off. However it is recommended that, when going downhill, and uphill, you hold onto the handle to prevent the possibility of tipping and/or a runaway.

Do not use the caddy to "pull" you up hill or drag the caddy uphill behind a riding cart.

TROUBLESHOOTING AND MAINTENANCE

1. No Power/Loss of Power


- * Check that the Power Switch on the Control Handle is in the "ON" position (See Operation section).
- * Check that the Jack plug is securely connected with the socket on the chassis. (See Operation section).
- * Check and ensure that the battery connections are all correct and secure. (See Battery Assembly section).
- * Check for solid connection of battery connector and chassis connector. (See Operation section).
- * Check battery for adequate charge and/or recharge.

2. To Clean Your Clubrunner Caddy

Disconnect and remove the battery before washing exterior surfaces with mild, soapy water.

Do not power wash.
